İNGİLTERE'DE ŞEHİR VE BÖLGE PLANLAMASI EĞİTİMİ

İNGİLTERE'DE ŞEHİR VE BÖLGE PLANLAMASI EĞİTİMİ

İngiltere'de şehir planlama eğitiminin başlangıcı 1900'lü yılların başına rastlamaktadır. Şehir planlama ile ilgili eğitime ilk kez University of Liverpool'da "Civic Design" kursları ile başlanmıştır. 1940'ların sonlarına kadar planlama yalnız mimar, mühendis ve sürveyörlerin bir yıl full-time, ya da iki yıl part-time eğitim yaparak kazandıkları ikinci bir meslek olarak kabul edilmiştir. Planlama lisans eğitimine ise 1945 yılında başlanmıştır.

İngiltere'de uzman plancı gereksinimi İkinci Dünya Savaşından sonra özellikle 1947 Şehir ve Kırsal Alan Planlama Yasasının yürürlüğe girmesinden, ilk yeni şehirlerin inşa edilmesinden ve kitle halinde yeniden yapım uygulamalarının başlamasından sonra çok belirgin bir şekilde ortaya çıkmıştır. 1950'li yıllara kadar planlama mesleği ile genellikle mimarlar ilgilenmiş, ilgili birimlerin mimarlık ve mühendislik büroları şehircilik çalışmalarını üstlenmişlerdi.

İngiltere'de planlamanın mimarlıktan farklı bir meslek olduğunun farkına varılması 1950'li yıllara rastlar. 1950'de hükümet tarafından görevlendirilen bir komite ihtiyaçlar karşısında gerekli bilgi ve yetenekle plancı yetiştirmek, planlama eğitimini iyileştirmek üzere çalışmalar yapmış, önerilerde bulunmuş ve bir rapor hazırlamıştır.

"Schuster Raporu" olarak bilinen komite önerilerini içeren rapor, İngiltere'de planlama eğitimi konusunda en eski ve çok önemli bir belgedir. Raporda özellikle yerel ve merkezi yönetimlerin yetenekli, nitelikli ve eğitimle plancı ihtiyacı üzerinde durulmuş, planlamanın bir ekip çalışması olduğu, disiplinlerarası bir çalışmayı gerektirdiği vurgulanmış ve farklı temel eğitimden gelen öğrencilerin bir ekonomistin, bir mimarın, bir hukukçunun birlikte ikinci kademe eğitimi yapmasının ortak çalışma alışkanlığı yaratması açısından yararları savunulmuştur. Raporda ayrıca farklı disiplinlerden gelen öğrencilerin eğitim göreceği ikinci kademe eğitiminin iki yıl olması önerilmiş, öğrencilerin planlama eğitimine başlamadan önce bir süre pratikte çalışmasının yararlarına değinilmiştir.

Raporun diğer bölümlerinde planlama bürolarında çalışan çeşitli düzeylerdeki teknisyenlerden büro şefine kadar çeşitli düzeylerdeki plancı ihtiyacı ortaya konmuştur.


Schuster Raporunun etkisi ile planlama okullarının programları planlama ekibindeki araştırma çalışmalarını yönlendiren ve araştırma aşamasını gerçekleştiren coğrafya, ekonomi, sosyal bilimle ilgili olanların, yaratıcı tasarım sanatı ile ilgili olan ve planı hazırlayan mimar, mühendis ve peyzaj mimarlarının, yönetim ve uygulama sistemi ile ilgili olan hukuk, ekonomi ve yönetimle uğraşanların bir arada eğitim göreceği kurslar halinde düzenlenmeye başlanmıştır.

Schuster Raporundan sonra planlama eğitimi tüm ülkede hızla gelişme göstermiş, özellikle 1960'ların ortalarından ve vavılma sonra planlama kurslarının sayısı hızla artmış ve büyük çeşitlilik göstermeye başlamıştır. Bu yıllarda planlama eğitiminde lisans yeni yüksek lisans programları da artmış, sonrası kurslar düzenlenmiştir. Programların ve programlara katılan öğrencilerin çeşitlenmesi nedeniyle planlama eğitimin de içeriğinin değiştiği eğitimi görülmüştür. Tasarım ağırlıklı planlama 1960'ların sosval bilim ağırlıklı olarak sonlarında geliştirilmiştir. Planlamanın bir üründen çok bir süreç olduğunun anlaşılmasından sonra politika analizleri planlama eğitiminde önemli bir rol oynamıştır. 1970'lerde İngiltere'de 18 full-time planlama okulu lisans ve yüksek lisans programlarını geliştirmiştir.

Diğer ülkelerde olduğu gibi İngiltere'de de planlama eğitiminde 1970'lerdeki gelişme 1980'li yılların başında bir krize dönüşmüştür. Ancak bu kriz bir meslek krizi olarak değil planlama okulları arasındaki rekabet sonucu ortaya çıkmıştır 1980'lerin başında 211 lisans, yüksek lisans diploma veya ihtisas programının var olması ve eğitim programlarının çok çeşitli dallara bölünmesi ve ülkenin her yanına dağılmış olması çeşitli sorunlar yaratmıştır. Bu sorunları çözmek ve dağınıklığı önlemek amacı ile programları bir düzene koyma başlatılmıştır. 1980'li yılların ortalarında çabaları bazı üniversitelerde ve politekniklerde planlama bölümleri kapatılmıştır. Her işi yapan plancı yaklaşımından vazgeçilerek ve ilgili alanlarda

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uzman ihtiyacı saptanarak "urban design" "transportation", "analytical techniques" gibi konularda uzman yetiştiren programlar geliştirilmiştir. Günümüzdeki plan lama programları genellikle sosyal bilimler alanı içinde yer almakta ve fiziki planlamanın önemi giderek azalmaktadır.

Ekteki lisans ve yüksek lisans programları incelendiğinde programların çeşitlilik gösterdiği ve birbirine benzeyen iki programın bulunmadığı görülür. İlgili üniversite ve politeknikler Royal Town Planning Institute'ün belirlediği içeriğe uygun olmak koşulu ile programlarını geliştirmektedirler.

Royal Town Planning Institute'ün belirlediği içerikle planlama programlara, planlama metodolojisi, fiziksel ve yasal çerçeve üst başlıklarında toplanmıştır (Ek: 1).

Programlar içinde bulundukları kurumun genel özelliklerine, kadroyu oluşturan öğretim elemanlarının ilgi alanlarına ve çalışma konularına göre bazıları teknik ve profesyonel hüner; bazıları yönetim konusuna ağırlık vermekte; bazıları fiziksel planlamaya, bazıları sosyal bilimlere önem vermektedir. Bazılarında bitirme ödevi olarak tez; bazılarında ise proje çalışmaları yapılmaktadır. Lisans programlarında lisans öğrencilerinin genel bilgilerle eğitildiği, yüksek lisans programlarında ise uzmanlaşmaya önem verildiği görülmektedir. Royal Town Planning Institute'un önerisi doğrultusunda özellikle etnik grupların kadınların ve özürlülerin kentsel mekanla ilişkilerini düzenleyen özel kurslar geliştirilmektedir.
